- V. Foreign Service of Process**

At our October 2022 meeting, the JC decided to address some issues as a “Committee of the Whole” instead of farming all issues out to the standing

committees. The JC proceeded to discuss the problems presented by foreign service of process, and tentatively concluded that:

- a. Wisconsin's law regarding service of process should probably be amended to allow service of process in whatever fashion is allowed by the Hague Convention in the Country where service is being sought, and
- b. Wisconsin's law should provide for a mechanism to allow courts to extend the time for foreign service when the plaintiff has been unable to secure service despite reasonable efforts to do so.

The Chair appointed an ad hoc subcommittee to study and report how other states handle service overseas. (See Minutes of October 2022 Meeting for details). We anticipate a Report from that ad hoc subcommittee and further discussion, as follows:
