Restraining Order Clinic

Mondays 9-Noon, Room 1001 (Next to Probate)

The restraining order clinic is a University of Wisconsin Law School program that can help organize information and complete and review forms and procedures for restraining orders. Law School students provide help, supervised by a clinical law professor. The students will supply no legal advice or advocacy.

Family Law Assistance Center

Wednesdays 11:30-1:30, Room L1000 (Assembly Room)

Offers assistance with forms and procedures related to family court; referrals to community resources; no legal advice. Staffed by volunteer attorneys, paralegals and law students; Spanish-speaking volunteers are available the first and third Wednesdays. Family Court Assistance Project
